Vintage Cocktail Corner

The Old Fashioned

According to Wikipedia, the first documented definition of the word "cocktail" was in an 1806 issue of *The Balance and Columbian Repository* in Hudson, New York. The paper's editor defined it as a potent concoction of spirits, bitters, water, and sugar. By the 1860s, with more liquors being available, cocktails were becoming more complex, but drinkers preferring something simpler began to ask for an "old-fashioned" cocktail, referring to the type of concoction described in 1806 but probably dating to much earlier.

This cocktail, which was already *old fashioned* 150 years ago, remains popular to this day. While it can be made with any spirit, Bourbon or Rye Whiskey are usually the spirits of choice today. The drink is served in its namesake Old Fashioned Glass, a short, wide glass that is also used for other on-the-rocks drinks.

Step back in time with this simple and tasty drink:

Place a sugar cube in old fashioned glass.

Saturate it with 2-3 dashes of Angostura bitters

Add a few dashes of plain water and muddle until the sugar is dissolved.

Add 1-1/2 ounce Bourbon or Rye Whiskey. Add ice cubes and garnish with an orange slice or zest and a cocktail cherry.

Note: If you don't have a sugar cube, substitute a teaspoon of sugar or simple syrup.


MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL


